
My Faith Looks Up to Thee

(Please observe a time of self-examination to reflect on our sins.)

P Receive this Good News: God, who is faithful and just, will forgive your sins and cleanse you of all your unfaithfulness. Through his Son Jesus Christ, who died for your sins and rose again, you have new life, grounded in faith, redeemed by grace and sustained by the Spirit. Therefore, I forgive you all your sins, in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit.

Gospel Reading - Luke 5:17-25

- P: The Gospel according to Luke the 5th Chapter
- C: Glory to you, O Lord.

On one of those days, as he was teaching, Pharisees and teachers of the law were sitting there, who had come from every village of Galilee and Judea and from Jerusalem. And the power of the Lord was with him to heal. And behold, some men were bringing on a bed a man who was paralyzed, and they were seeking to bring him in and lay him before Jesus, but finding no way to bring him in, because of the crowd, they went up on the roof and let him down with his bed through the tiles into the midst before Jesus. And when he saw their faith, he said, "Man, your sins are forgiven you." And the scribes and the Pharisees began to question, saying, "Who is this who speaks blasphemies? Who can forgive sins but God alone?" When Jesus perceived their thoughts, he answered them, "Why do you question in your hearts? Which is easier, to say, 'Your sins are forgiven you,' or to say, 'Rise and walk'? But that you may know that the Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins"—he said to the man who was paralyzed—"I say to you, rise, pick up your bed and go home." And immediately he rose up before them and picked up what he had been lying on and went home, glorifying God.

Apostles' Creed

Address and Questions

Sister in Christ, do you intend to continue in the covenant of your baptism among God's people in this place?

(Christine responds): I do, and I ask God to help and guide me.

(The minister addresses the assembly): People of God, do you promise to support and pray for Christine in her life in Christ?

We do, and we ask God to help and guide us.

Welcome

A representative of the congregation addresses the assembly.

Let us welcome this sister in Christ to this community of faith.

(Congregation responds): We rejoice with you in the life of baptism. Together we will give thanks and praise to God and proclaim the good news to all the world.








Thanksgiving at the Table: AUTUMN

Holy God, our Bread of life, our Table, and our Food, you created a world in which all might be satisfied by your abundance.
